01 // Beach Bible

The pristine beaches of the Marino Ballena National Park in Uvita are all within a 20 to 30 minute drive. They include Uvita Beach, Arco Beach, Ballena Beach and Chamán Beach. A little further afield you'll also find Ventanas Beach, Hermosa Beach and Dominical. During the week, you may be pleasantly surprised to find very few other visitors on these stunning shores.

During your stay, we offer scheduled transfers every day at low tide to Uvita Beach for the Whale's Tail. Let us know the evening before if you would like to visit the beach and we will check the times for you. Any time you hit the beach, we'll provide you with ice water and towels.

Playa Uvita

At low tide, walk out to the iconic sandbar shaped like a whale's tail*. The reef that protects this remarkable formation from dangerous currents and strong waves makes it a perfect place to swim. The southern end of the beach is also excellent for amateur surfers. From Kurà it's easy to underestimate the scale of this beach – there are approximately 2km between the entrance of the beach and the tip of the whale's tail.

Playa Chamán

This pretty pebble beach* is great for swimming, especially on the south side, and a picturesque spot to watch the fishermen in action, anchoring their boats in the small tranquil bay. It holds the Blue Flag eco award for its cleanliness, security and beauty.

Playa Ventanas

Wonderfully scenic, this beach is surrounded by mountains and gets its name from the 'windows' formed by vast rocky caves and tunnels right at the water's edge. At low tide, there is much to explore. Tucked away and reminiscent of Jurassic Park, Ventanas is one of the best secluded beaches in the area – and a perfect spot to try our traditional "Churchill" snow cones.

Playa Dominical

With waves for more experienced surfers, this lively little village has an abundance of picturesque beachfront bars and restaurants, as well as colorful stalls selling beachwear and knick-knacks. Here is the spot to grab a bite or a board, and spend an hour or two exploring.

Playa Hermosa

The light grey sands of sprawling Hermosa (meaning 'beautiful' in English) provide the perfect spot to catch a gorgeous sunset while watching the local surfers and boogie boarders. Grab an 'agua de pipa' (coconut water) and enjoy the people-watching.

National Parks & Biological Preserves

For those who like their nature pristine, protected and bursting with biodiversity, the following curated tours take you to the heart of Costa Rica's most beloved ecosystems, where the waters are warm, the wildlife is abundant and the adventures are inspiring.

Marino Ballena National Park

Named after the Spanish for 'whale', the Marino Ballena National Park covers 100 hectares of beach and rainforest – including the iconic Whale's Tail sandbar formation – and stretches out some 5,375 hectares into the Pacific Ocean.

Every year, humpback whales migrate from both hemispheres to the warm tropical waters of Costa Rica. They visit from mid-July through October and Marino Ballena National Park is their favorite spot.

Waterfalls Tour

This experience will begin at the Cascada Verde waterfall in Uvita; this small charming waterfall boasts a natural pool, a 3-meter-high platform and a stone slide. Travelling south along the coast, you will visit the gorgeous Playa Ventanas with its incredible stone caves formations, before culminating the experience at the mystical Pavón Waterfall in the village of Ojochal.

Please note this is a private couple experience instead of a group trip.

Whale & Dolphin Watching

Explore our shores in search of breaching humpback whales (July-October) and two different species of playful resident dolphin. Other species occasionally spotted include Bryde's, pilot and false killer whales as well as whale sharks. Round off your tour by snorkeling amongst the coral and rocky reefs of the National Park discovering the wonderfully colorful marine life that thrives beneath the surface.

Marino Ballena Nature Walk

Explore the lush vegetation of the Ballena Marine National Park to as you get into the trails in search of birds and wildlife along the route. With the help of a naturalist guide you will be able to see from howlers to white-faced monkeys, from bats even raccoons and even crocodiles while exploring this area unique features, natural history and delicate ecosystems.

Please note this is a private couple experience instead of a group trip.

Corcovado National Park

Despite our size, impressively, Costa Rica is home to almost 5% of the world's biodiversity. And holding some 3% of that biodiversity is Corcovado, the largest area of primary rainforest on the Pacific coast. Located on the Osa Peninsula, Corcovado National Park has been described by National Geographic as "the most biologically intense place on Earth".

Corcovado Nature Hike

Speed over to Corcovado National Park's San Pedrillo ranger station by boat, taking in inspiring views of the Osa coastline during the 1.5 hour journey. At the park you'll hike two different trails, the first around 3 hours long followed by lunch, and the second – leading to a waterfall – approximately 1.5 hours long. Both provide a fantastic opportunity to encounter numerous mammals such as howler, spider and white-faced monkeys, sloths, coatis, raccoons and tapirs, as well as a great variety of birds, plants, and endangered trees that have been standing for centuries.

Caño Island Biological Reserve

This small island lies approximately 20 km offshore from the Osa Peninsula at Drake Bay, and is well-known for its beaches and coral reefs which are home to 19 coral species. Caño Island's real attraction is underwater, where its rich sea life includes species from white-tipped sharks to manta rays and many colorful reef fish. Formerly a pre-Columbian burial ground, Caño Island is also a site of great archaeological importance, preserving an important part of Costa Rican indigenous history.

Snorkeling at Caño Island

Take a scenic 1hr and half boat trip out to Caño Island, the paradisiacal setting for some of Costa Rica's very best snorkeling. Here you'll explore the island's pristine coral reefs, observing a great variety of marine species – many of which are in danger of extinction – before heading over to Violines Island for a picnic lunch and an afternoon of beach relaxation on its picturesque shores.

Scuba Diving at Caño Island

Hop over to Caño Island by boat to explore beyond the waves at some of the world's best dive sites. The protected waters of this marine park are home to an astounding variety of both pelagic and reef fish, meaning it's not uncommon to swim beside large schools of jacks and barracudas, sting and manta rays, as well as sharks. With dive sites ranging from 10-40m and great visibility year round, there is plenty to discover under the surface.

PADI Certification is required to book this tour.

Nauyaca

Waterfalls Hike

The spectacular natural wonder known as Nauyaca comprises two impressive waterfalls. Hike over a 4km route to reach the first which stands at 45m in free fall, and a second tiered fall standing at 20m. Together they form a 1,000sqm pool perfect for swimming, and a number of smaller natural pools for paddling.

Rancho La Merced Horseback Riding

With its scenic pasture land, beautiful rainforest reserve, its mangroves and its waterside setting, the vast 1250-acre Rancho La Merced National Wildlife Refuge makes the ideal spot for an adventure on horseback. Explore the reserve with a knowledgeable guide, passing by rivers and riding along the beach, spotting birds and other tropical flora and fauna en route.

Rancho La Merced offers various horse trails:

- Day time waterfall horseback ride, 9 am and 2 pm (dry season)
- Beachfront horseback ride, daytime or sunset (tide dependent)

Birdwatching Tour

Mountain Rainforest Tour near Kurà

This tour will lead you to explore the mountains around Kurà, enjoying the peace of the misty morning and the embrace of the trees, scouting for the native birds that inhabit the area.

Tour at Refugio Nacional de Vida Silvestre Barú

This tour takes place in the coastal rainforest, where, with the help of a naturalist guide, will explore the various hiding places of our tropical birdlife, spotting trogons, toucans, woodpeckers, as well as many other species that inhabit the forest.

Sloth Tour

This is an exciting and rewarding excursion specifically focussed on spotting the sloths camouflaged in the trees! During this gentle hike around the streets of the laid back town of Bahía Ballena and the Marino Ballena National Park, we will have the opportunity to see many other animals as well, such as different species of monkeys and birds. While we search for the timid sloths, your knowledgeable guide will explain you everything about the species you will encounter and their habitat.

Boruca Indigenous Reserve Excursion

Practical info //

The Boruca culture has strongly influenced the creation of the hotel in several aspects: from the name "Kurà", which means jaguar in the Boruca language, to the design of the logo, to the decoration with the carved wooden masks that are the work of Boruca artisans.

The tour begins with a hike to the waterfalls for a refreshing swim. After the visit to the town and the local museum, you will participate in a mask-making workshop where you will learn about the entire process from materials, design, carving, and painting.

After enjoying a delicious traditional lunch, you will assist in a textile workshop, where you will discover how fabrics are dyed with natural pigments, and how various textile craft products are made.

Villas Alturas Wildlife Refuge

Villas Alturas is perched aside the lush Escaleras mountains, with dazzling views over the Pacific Ocean and home to the Alturas Wildlife Sanctuary, dedicated to the rescue and conservation of Costa Rica's endangered wildlife.

Visitors will meet the sanctuary residents while learning about their history, biology and conservation needs. Here you can meet a variety of animals including: spider monkeys, capuchin monkeys, sloths, parrots, toucans, peccary, and kinkajous.

This heartwarming tour also provides information on Alturas Wildlife Sanctuary's history, their aims and objectives and our rescue work.

In accordance to Costa Rican law, it is prohibited to touch the animals.

We will set out on a guided walking meditation and nature experience through the lush rainforest roads surrounding Kurà; with the help of a guide we will have the opportunity to spot some of the local wildlife, on the way to our panoramic yoga spot.

After we settle in the space, a 30 min session of restorative yoga flow and mindfulness meditation will be offered accompanied by the peaceful sounds of nature.

Featuring 10 platforms, rappelling at 50 foot tall trees, and a rope descent into a natural pool to end the adventure enjoying a waterfall with a natural stone slide, there are few jungle adventures more exciting than this.

You'll spot crabs scuttling along the roots, catch a glimpse of marine birds tucked away amongst the foliage and enjoy the peace of these hidden waterways as you glide through the canals and weave amongst the mangrove roots. After a short rest, we will paddle a scenic loop to Uvita beach.

No previous kayak experience is required.

Mangrove Wildlife Tour by Boat

The Sierpe river is the most extensive wetland and mangrove ecosystem in all of Costa Rica. It is fed from the mystical Sierpe lagoon where it starts, flows all the way down to the Pacific Ocean and is connected with the Térraba river, the largest river of the country and later returns back upriver with salt water as high tide rises. This rich wetland ecosystem provides its inhabitants with an incredible diversity of wildlife, given that it's located at the entrance to the Osa Peninsula.

As soon as we take off from Sierpe with the boat and enter the meanders of the mangroves watercourse, you will be able to spot the iguanas perched on tree branches and roots, crocodiles, which are very common on the river sides, snakes and turtles, different species of monkeys racoons, coatis and many birds.

You'll pass through several streams, coffee fincas and banana plantations en route to the majestic San Luis waterfall – one of the tallest in Costa Rica – then to a second waterfall for a snack and a refreshing swim.

Enjoy the ride individually or share the adventure on a side-by-side quad.

Catch & Release Boat Fishing

This tour is departing from the beautiful Quepos Marina Pez Vela, on the Central Pacific coast, home to some of the country's major fishing tournaments.

Choosing between a full day or half day tour, you will be able to experience the thrill of catching (with a bit of luck!) some big fish such as dorado, a yellowfin tuna, marlin or swordfish, before releasing them back into the deep ocean waters.
